National Endowment for the Humanities Honors Miller Center of Public Affairs

Charlottesville , VA – November 21, 2005

The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) has recognized the Miller Center of Public Affairs' web site WhiteHouseTapes.org (www.whitehousetapes.org) as one of the best online resources for education in the humanities.

The panel of judges determined that the site met the EDSITEment criteria for intellectual quality, content, design, and most importantly, classroom impact.

As part of the honor, the web site will be highlighted on the NEH EDSITEment web page (www.edsiteement.neh.gov) in December.

“We are honored to be recognized as a wonderful resource for students, scholars and those who have an interest in American history and how our country is governed,” said Presidential Recordings Program Director Tim Naftali. “With over 500,000 hits and 25,000 unique visitors a month, WhiteHouseTapes.org has become a magnet for national interest in the Miller Center and a major outlet through which to share what we do.”

WhiteHouseTapes.org was developed as part of the Miller Center's Presidential Recordings Program. The site is home to tapes from President Franklin Roosevelt through Richard Nixon. It is designed as a service to the research community by making freely available all of the presidential recordings, along with relevant research materials, so that scholars, teachers, students, and the public can hear and use these remarkable tapes for themselves.

The Presidential Recordings Program was established by the Miller Center in 1998 to make the secret White House recordings accessible through transcripts and historical research.

The Presidential Recordings Program is just one of the many programs at the Miller Center which include the [Presidential Oral History Program](#), [AmericanPresident.org](#) (also located on the NEH web site), the [American Political Development Program](#), the [Forum Program](#) and the [Public Service Program](#).
